Bufo (Cane) Toad Poisoning

Bufo toads (also known as cane toads, marine toads, or giant toads) are brown to grayish-brown with black or white spots. Adult toads generally range in size from 6 to 9 inches, but may get larger. Yech! When confronted by a predator, a cane toad secretes a white toxin from the glands on the back of its head. The secretions are highly toxic to dogs and

Bufo toads are most frequently seen at night and to avoid attracting toads to areas where pets are, do not leave pet food in open dishes outside. Dogs may bite or lick bufo toads, thus receiving a large dose of the toxins which are directly into the bloodstream. The poison contains cardiac and hallucinogenic toxins.

Symptoms occur within minutes, and can include foamy salivation, difficulty breathing, red-colored gums, staggering and stumbling, vomiting, convulsions or seizure activity, and irregular heartbeat. If the poisoning is left untreated, the death rate from Bufo toad poisoning is very high! There is no antidote for the bufo toad poison, so immediate first aid followed by treatment in the veterinary hospital is required to survive. Hospital treatment consists of intravenous fluids and medications to counteract the seizure activity and cardiac abnormalities.

If you think that your pet has encountered a bufo toad, immediately rinse out your pet's mouth with a soaking wet washcloth several times to remove any toxin from the mouth. Thoroughly wipe out the insides of the lips and cheeks, as well as the gums on the outside of the teeth. Do not use a hose to rinse the mouth as water can be accidentally inhaled into the lungs causing a life-threatening condition called "aspiration pneumonia." Proceed to the nearest veterinary clinic or emergency clinic, as the toxin acts quickly and time is of the essence. The smaller the pet or the larger the toad, the greater the risk of toxicity.

Protect your pets -Google humane ways to eliminate BOFO frogs in your yard.

Always wear gloves!
